Sheri Smith, Little Landers Historical Society / Bolton Hall – There are no second Saturday events at Bolton Hall in July and August due to no air-conditioning. Roger Swart – There will be two neighborhood watch meetings next week. Sunland Starbucks at 9 am on Monday, July 15 and another in the evening on Tuesday, July 16, 6:00 pm at the Sunland-Tujunga Public Library. This is a great opportunity to meet your LAPD Senior Lead Officers and find out what is going on in the community.

Nicole Royer, Director of the Sunland Recreation Center – The center is offering girl's summer programs which include dance, cheerleading and sports programs. Also offering many adult classes.

### Item 6 Representative Announcements and Reports

Senior Lead Officer (SLO) Cesar Contreras, Sunland – Jon von Gunten gave his report since officer Contreras could not attend tonight's meeting: Part 1 crimes are down 30% over last year. The LAPD has mission areas in Sunland Tujunga, one of them is Mount Gleason Avenue north of Foothill. They are also having problems with residents leaving their cars running to quickly get something at convenience stores to come out and find their cars gone. It is also important to check that residence windows are closed when leaving the home. The LAPD is working on quality of life issues and is beginning to enforce City Ordinance 56.11 which requires those living in tents take them down during daytime hours.

Eve Sinclair --- Area Director for Councilwoman Monica Rodriguez' office -- Construction has begun at North Valley City Hall, the Councilwoman's staff is working out of Pacoima City Hall. Staff are keeping their existing contact numbers. Sunland Park is going to get improved security lighting and a new swing set this summer. There is going to be a movie at Sunland Park on Friday, July 19<sup>th</sup>. The movie, Black Panther, starts at 7:30 pm. There will be churros and other refreshments as well as STEM projects for the children. The Community Garden is having a clean-up / barbeque event in coordination with the Love the Neighborhood Initiative this Saturday at 8:00am. There are still a few beds available. Homelessness is down 28% in Council District 7, one of only two in the city to have a reduction in the number of homeless. Use the lahop.org website if you know of anyone experiencing homelessness that needs assistance. Councilwoman Rodriguez obtained 4 million dollars for traffic improvements in the area. We will be getting left hand turn signals at Foothill and Mt. Gleason and Foothill and Oro Vista, flashing pedestrian cross walks in front of the Tujunga fire station and at Foothill and Wyngate. These projects are in the bidding process and will hopefully be completed by 2021. There is also going to be a new stop sign at Marnice and Foothill. Jon von Gunten inquired about the letter the STAT Committee sent to the Councilwoman regarding more traffic enforcement in the area given the number of serious auto accidents. Director Sinclair said she had not yet seen the letter.

Jason Maruca—SFV Assistant Field Deputy for LA County Supervisor Karen Barger –Supervisor Barger enjoyed being in our 4<sup>th</sup> of July Parade. She is co-sponsoring the Summer Movie night in Sunland Park on July 19<sup>th</sup> and supplying churros for the event. She is also co-sponsoring the stop senior scams event at the Elks Club on July 16<sup>th</sup>.

Arturo Garcia-Mendoza -- Representative for California Assembly Woman Luz Rivas - The assemblywoman also enjoyed riding in the 4<sup>th</sup> of July parade. She has obtained 5 million to build a sustainability park at the Discovery Cube. She also obtained 1 million to hire 6 additional staff to address homeless issues. Luz Rivas supports AB 1702 that will give the City more funds to address homeless issues. There is a brochure on the back table with contact numbers if you know of anyone who is the victim of elder abuse. The real ID requirement will become effective in October 2020, the DMV requires original documents. It is a good idea to fill out the form online before going to the DMV If you have any issues with state agencies like DMV's real id requirements, etc., feel free to contact Luiz Rivas' office (818) 504-3911.

## Item 9 Neighborhood Council General Board Orientation

Gibson Nyambura will be our neighborhood council's new Neighborhood Empowerment Advocate, replacing Semee Park. Mr. Nyambura gave a brief overview of the duties of neighborhood council board members including communication, positive work flow, accountability, need for decorum in meetings and social media, and key ordinances and rules pertaining to the conduct of neighborhood council meetings. These topics will be covered in more detail during the STNC Board retreat.

#### Item 10 STNC New Board Retreat

The retreat will be Saturday, July 20; 10 am to 1 pm for all STNC board members.

#### Item 11 Board Member Updates

- a. President, Liliana Sanchez -- the move from North Valley City Hall has been completed. Previous and current board members need to return any STNC property so it can be inventoried and kept in the storage units so other members can use the equipment and so the President, who is responsible for these items, can keep track of them. The board is still looking for office space to rent and for a Parliamentarian to attend general board meetings.
- b. Lydia Grant, VP Community Improvement VP Grant would like to continue approval of a new committee members until next meeting so their mission statement can be revised. Board Member Belt is interested in joining the committee to explore the possibility of having a dog park in the community. VP Grant gave an update on Senate bill 516, the proposal to prohibit towing cars that violate parking or registration ordinances. This bill is still being debated and revised. VP Grant also gave updates on two new proposed building bills, Senate bill 330 and Senate bill 592 that limit the power of cities to hold hearings on or object to proposed structures and zoning changes. VP Grant feels it is important to voice opposition to these laws before they are enacted. The City has voted to oppose these bills.
- c. Nina Royal, VP Outreach -- VP Royal attended the Equestrian Faire and met 10 people who were interested in the neighborhood council. She is still working on a selection of a location for Outreach meetings; they have been at local restaurants to help support local business. Meetings are the second Tuesday of the month. Secretary Cleghorn noted that 10 more members can be added to this committee. National Night Out is August 6, 2019 at Little Landers Park, 6:00 pm to 9:00 pm. Bolton Hall Museum will also be open so those attending the event can see the museum at the same time. Board Member Belt asked if there is also going to be an event at Sunland Park. VP Royal responded that to her knowledge no one has volunteered to organize an event at Sunland Park this year.

The Sunland Tujunga Neighborhood Council (STNC) supports the general concept and design plan of the proposed project at 6454 Foothill Blvd., with the exception of the following concerns presented by neighbors and the community:

- (1) the additional traffic generated by this business on residential streets
- (2) the increased level of noise generated by the 24-hour operation especially in the late evening and early mornings
- (3) that the buildings comply with the Zoning and Foothill Boulevard Specific Plan Design Standards
- (4) proximity to adjacent pre-school, and
- (5) health hazards for adjacent pre-school and adjacent residents.

The STNC Land Use Committee (LUC) met with the owner/applicant on three occasions.

- 1. May 21, 2018 The new owner appeared at the Land Use Committee an impromptu appearance to inform the community of their intentions to open an ARCO gas station and convenience store with 24-hour convenience store at the location.
- 2. November 19, 2018 Outreach to the immediate neighbors/residents was made by the STNC Land Use Committee in the interim. Many of the nearby residents protested against the gas station. The lot has been vacant ten to twenty years and some neighbors stated that they were informed when they purchased their homes that a gas station would never be allowed to open at the site.
- 3. July 1, 2019 The LUC met with Applicant. Renderings of the proposed ARCO gas station and convenience store included new perimeter including at the sidewalk landscaping, and of a six-foot block wall to be constructed along the full south side of the property adjacent to the single-family residence. Some residents expressed a concern that living so close and with a pre-school adjacent to the proposed gas station would present health hazards to the residents and their children.

It is the understanding at this time that the Application for this project has not yet been completed and that the Planning Department is still waiting on the results of a soil test which the applicant believes should be completed shortly. The Applicant has committed to returning to the STNC Land Use Committee in the future when the Application is complete.

I propose that the STNC allocate funds from their Community Outreach or some other group to advertise every two weeks, the events that the NC is active in. Nina Royal, when her newspaper was viable, was very adept in creating a community calendar. It is a very trying job pulling all that information together. I suggest that a one-quarter page advertisement would meet your needs, and with the help of the STNC board and area reps, would be very comprehensive and a benefit to both the NC and the community at large.

The STNC already knows how effective The Foothills Paper is in getting news out to the people. When groups advertise with us, it also goes on our Facebook site and our Internet website at no additional cost.

A one-quarter page ad would cost the NC \$100. A discount from the regular \$150 advertised price. The advantage of advertising with The Foothills Paper is the fact that we are distributed every TWO weeks, and in some months, THREE times. There is no other newspaper in the S-T community that has the coverage that we provide.

We have a current & up to date Business Tax certificate approved by the city of Los Angeles. *This is for a 12 month contract only.* We accept credit cards, Paypal or checks for payment.

I am requesting that this proposal be submitted to the board for consideration as soon as possible. I am available to make this presentation to the Budget Committee.
