RE: Request for DOT Left-Turn Studies on Foothill Blvd. at Oro Vista Avenue and Mt. Gleason Avenue Intersections

Dear Brian,

On behalf of our stakeholders, the Sunland-Tujunga Neighborhood Council (STNC) would like to formally request an investigation and traffic engineering assessment, specifically for left turn arrows being added to existing traffic signals at two major intersections in our community. The requested intersections are Oro Vista Avenue and Foothill Boulevard and Mt. Gleason Avenue and Foothill Boulevard for east and west drivers traveling on Foothill Boulevard.

Both intersections experience heavy traffic volume between 7:00am-9:00am and 3:30pm-7:00pm. Both intersections are highly accessed by driving, cycling and walking pedestrians. Having left turn traffic signals for the traffic traveling Eastbound and Westbound on Foothill Boulevard will greatly improve the safety of our residents utilizing them. Traffic flow would also be positively affected.

The Sunland-Tujunga population has grown steadily over the past 10 years and traffic volume has increased right along with it. The increase in the number of auto collisions on Foothill Boulevard has been massive. This year alone there have been 10+ auto collisions on Foothill Boulevard and more tragically, there was a fatality at the McVine/Foothill Blvd. intersection in October 2013. Yet, there have been no modifications or upgraded traffic signals to better handle the increase of traffic volume. The last traffic signal upgrade in Sunland-Tujunga was for the addition of a left turn arrow to the signal at the Sunland Boulevard/Fenwick intersection, petitioned for by our then sitting Councilwoman Wendy Greuel.

Oro Vista Avenue/Foothill Blvd. Intersection

- On September 24, 2014, a very bad accident occurred at this intersection between a motorcycle and a car. The motorcycle rider ended up under the car and was fortunate to not have been seriously injured.
- Our current STNC board Secretary was involved in an accident (another vehicle hit hers) when trying to make a left-hand turn in 2014
- ➤ Intersection has a high volume of pedestrian traffic between the hours of 7:00am 9:00pm.

Mt. Gleason Avenue/Foothill Blvd. Intersection

- ➤ Back in 2012 the STNC requested that DOT perform a study on this intersection for the purpose of adding left turn arrows for all Foothill Blvd traffic. The recommendation from DOT was to add a "no left turn sign" for north-bound traffic on Mt. Gleason. This change did nothing to address the left-turning eastbound and westbound traffic on Foothill Blvd at the intersection.
- > Westbound traffic on Foothill Blvd is in a down-hill mode before this intersection, therefore arriving at and traveling at a higher speed through it; making it extremely dangerous when attempting to make a left hand turn during the above-mentioned rush hour times.
- ➤ One of our current STNC board members disclosed that he almost lost his life in an accident at this intersection in 2005. Another board members' close family friend was hit straight on when attempting to make a left hand turn back in 2010.

Our STNC Region 4 Representative, Maureen O'Byrne, collaborated with a local resident, Lynne Robin Green to create an online petition (at thepetitionsite.com) to support our cause specifically. A copy of the final petition is enclosed for your review and has 124 resident stakeholders signatures of support.

In conclusion, the STNC fully supports the community request of adding left turn traffic signals to both these intersections and would like to formally request that DOT conduct left-turn traffic studies at the earliest opportunity.

Thank you for your support and assistance in making our community a safer place to reside in. Please let us know when you are able to complete the studies so we can schedule a presentation to the community.
